The image of Canadians in the world's eye is primarily positive, warm, generous, polite, always saying please, thank you and sorry. The London based Legatum Institute also listed the country as the most tolerant in the world in 2015. However, a lurking darkness behind Canada's gilded image is slowly seeping into public view as discriminatory, Islamophobic, anti-Semitic and racist acts are on the rise" (Arab News, 2022, para. 2).
